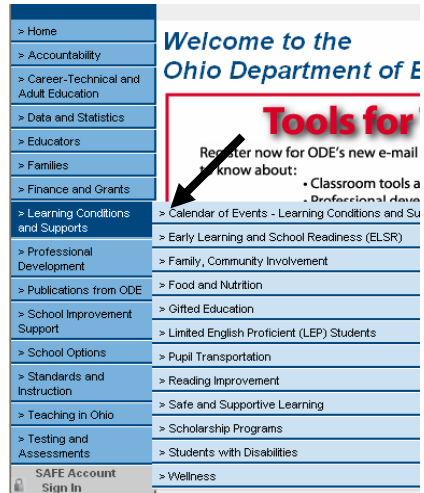
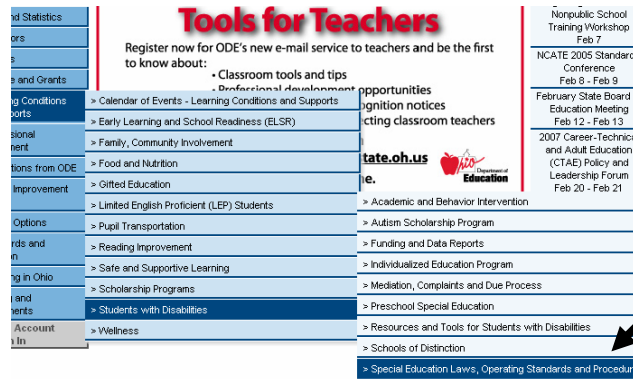
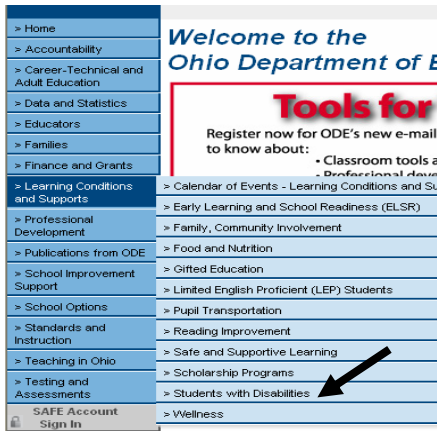


Navigating to the Ohio Operating Standards for Ohio Schools Serving Children with Disabilities

2. On the left Menu bar click on Learning Conditions and Supports

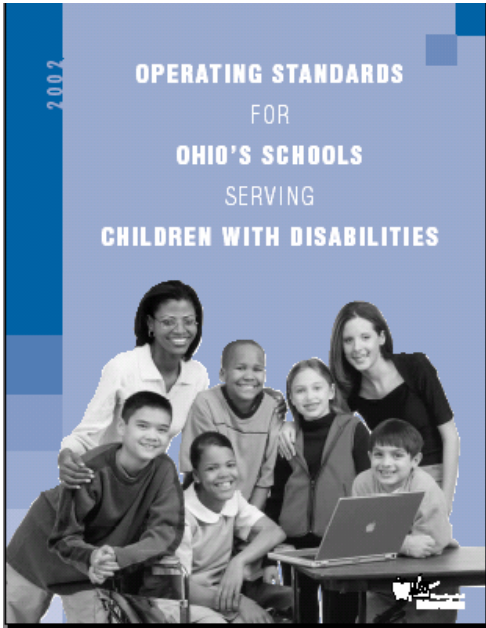




3. Click on Students with Disabilities
